Novel Association of Blepharophimosis with Xanthoma Tuberosum

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Six year old male presenting with multiple eruptions over flexure aspect of knees, ankle, buttock, and palms incidentally found to have Blepharophimosis, ptosis, epicanthus inversus syndrome. These co-existing autosomal dominant mutations for BPES and Familial hypercholesterolemia in a single patient has never been reported in literature till date.
